Product Description:

Genomic RNA was isolated from a preparation of pooled allantoic fluid from specific pathogen free (SPF) embryonated chicken eggs infected with influenza A virus, A/duck/Czechoslovakia/1956 (H4N6).

Influenza A virus, A/duck/Czechoslovakia/1956 (H4N6) was isolated from a duck in what is now Slovakia in 1956. Sequence information is available for influenza A virus, A/duck/Czechoslovakia/1956 (H4N6) at the [Influenza Research Database](#).

NR-43012 has been qualified for PCR applications by amplification of an approximately 1025 nucleotide sequence. Recommended dilutions for successful RT-PCR amplification are indicated on the Certificate of Analysis for each lot.

Material Provided:

Each vial contains 100 µL of viral genomic RNA in TE buffer (10 mM Tris-HCl, 1 mM EDTA, pH 7.0). The viral genomic RNA is in a background of cellular nucleic acid and carrier RNA. The vial should be centrifuged prior to opening.

Packaging/Storage:

NR-43012 was packaged aseptically in screw-capped plastic cryovials. The product is provided frozen on dry ice and should be stored at -60°C or colder immediately upon arrival. Freeze-thaw cycles should be minimized.
