Antibody Class: IgG1κ
 Mouse monoclonal antibody prepared against *Leishmania panamensis* (*L. panamensis*), strain WR120 (MHOM/PA/74/WR120), clone B-11 was purified from the hybridoma supernatant by protein G affinity chromatography. The B cell hybridoma was generated by the fusion of NS1 (P3-X63/Ag8-NS1) myeloma cells with immunized BALB/c mouse splenocytes. Clone B-11 recognizes *L. panamensis*.¹⁻³

Strain WR120 belongs to the *Viannia* subgenus of *Leishmania* and has been variously referred to in the literature as *L. braziliensis panamensis*, *L. panamensis* and *L. (V) panamensis*.¹⁻³

Material Provided:

Each vial contains approximately 100 µL of purified monoclonal antibody in PBS (pH 7.4). The concentration, expressed as mg per mL, is shown on the Certificate of Analysis.

Packaging/Storage:

NR-50152 was packaged aseptically in screw-capped plastic vials and is provided frozen on dry ice. The product should be stored at -20°C or colder immediately upon arrival. Freeze-thaw cycles should be avoided.

Functional Activity:

NR-50152 is reported to react with *L. panamensis* membrane proteins and to function in ELISA, radioimmunoassays, and western blot analysis.¹⁻³
