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Product Description:

NR-50457 is acute plasma collected from a human subject who returned from travel to Honduras with a confirmed Zika virus (ZIKV) infection. The sample was obtained on May 20, 2016, three days after the onset of symptoms. This case represents a secondary flavivirus exposure based on virus- and type-specific neutralizing antibody titers (see Functional Activity section below).¹

Material Provided:

Each vial contains approximately 25 µL of plasma.

Packaging/Storage:

NR-50457 was packaged aseptically in screw-capped plastic cryovials. The product is provided frozen and should be stored at -60°C or colder immediately upon arrival. Freeze-thaw cycles should be avoided.

- ZIKV – 15
- Dengue virus type 1 (DENV1) – 354
- Dengue virus type 2 (DENV2) – 561
- Dengue virus type 3 (DENV3) – 455
- Dengue virus type 4 (DENV4) – 105
