Product Description:

Genomic RNA was extracted from a preparation of cell lysate and supernatant from *Cercopithecus aethiops* kidney cells (Vero E6; ATCC® CRL-1586™) infected with severe acute respiratory syndrome-related coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2), isolate hCoV-19/USA/New York-PV09158/2020.¹ SARS-CoV-2, isolate hCoV-19/USA/New York-PV09158/2020 was isolated on March 22, 2020 from a nasal swab collected from a patient with a fatal respiratory illness in New York, USA.¹

NR-53520 has been qualified for PCR applications by amplification of an approximately 950 base pairs of the open reading frame 1ab (ORF1ab) gene. Recommended dilutions for successful RT-PCR amplification are indicated on the Certificate of Analysis for each lot.

Material Provided:

Each vial contains approximately 100 µL of viral genomic RNA in TE buffer (10 mM Tris-HCl, 1 mM EDTA). The viral genomic RNA is in a background of cellular nucleic acid and carrier RNA. The vial should be centrifuged prior to opening.

Packaging/Storage:

NR-53520 was packaged aseptically in screw-capped plastic cryovials. The product is provided frozen on dry ice and should be stored at -60°C or colder immediately upon arrival. Freeze-thaw cycles should be minimized.
